Call to Order:

The meeting was called to order at 12:10 p.m. by Chairperson Williams, at which time a quorum was established.

Chairperson Williams proceeded with roll call. All Board members confirmed that they were present and alone in their off-site locations.

Minutes:

It was moved by Mr. Murata, seconded by Vice Chairperson Hall, and unanimously carried to approve the meeting minutes of the open session and the meeting minutes of the executive session of the February 28, 2023, meeting as circulated.

Executive Officer's  
Report:

Chairperson Williams asked if any members of the public would like to provide oral testimony on this agenda item. There were none.

Executive Officer Green reminded the Board members that the 2023 Annual Financial Disclosure is due on May 31, 2023.

C. Hawaii State Ethics Commission – Ethics Training

Executive Officer Green stated that beginning January 1, 2023, all state legislators, state employees, and members of the state boards and commissions are required to take ethics training on a periodic basis. It must be taken every four (4) years. The due date for the 2023 year is May 29, 2023.

Licensing:

Chairperson Williams asked if any members of the public would like to provide oral testimony on this agenda item. There were none.

At 12:17 p.m., it was moved by Chairperson Williams, seconded by Vice Chairperson Hall, and unanimously carried for the Board to enter into Executive Session to consider and evaluate personal information relating to individuals applying for licensure in accordance with HRS section 92-5(a)(1), and to consult with the Board’s attorney on questions and issues pertaining to the Board’s powers, duties, privileges, immunities, and liabilities in accordance with HRS section 92-5(a)(4). (Note: Board members and staff entered into Microsoft Teams).

## EXECUTIVE SESSION

At 1:22 p.m., it was moved by Vice Chairperson Hall, seconded by Chairperson Williams, and unanimously carried for the Board to move out of Executive Session and to reconvene to the Board's regular order of business.

### A. Shop Applications:

(New: Beauty Shop License – Nail Technology)

It was moved by Vice Chairperson Hall, seconded by Mr. Murata, and unanimously carried to approve the beauty shop application of Hele Mai Beauty, LLC, and to direct its Executive Officers to send a letter of education regarding the license classifications.

- ii. Maricel Lamug  
Skinglamour\_Aesthetics, LLC  
(New: Beauty Shop License – Esthetics)

It was moved by Vice Chairperson Hall, seconded by Mr. Murata, and unanimously carried to approve the beauty shop application of Skinglamour\_Aesthetics, LLC.

### B. Beauty School Application:

- i. Margaret Williams  
Honolulu Barber School, LTD  
(New: Beauty School License – Cosmetology, Hairdressing, Beauty Instructor)

Chairperson Williams recused herself from voting on this matter.

It was moved by Vice Chairperson Hall, seconded by Mr. Murata, and it was voted on by Vice Chairperson Hall, Mr. Murata, Mr. Basta, and Mr. Yap to approve the beauty school application of Honolulu Barber School, LTD, for Cosmetology, Hairdresser, and Beauty Instructor.

### C. Applications for Restoration of License:

- i. Shavonne-Mae Panglao  
(Beauty Operator: Esthetician)

It was moved by Vice Chairperson Hall, seconded by Mr. Murata, and unanimously carried to approve Ms. Panglao's beauty operator application, with NIC examination waiver.

- ii. Kimberlee Pagco  
(Beauty Operator: Esthetician)

It was moved by Vice Chairperson Hall, seconded by Mr. Murata, and unanimously carried to approve Ms. Pagco's beauty operator application, with NIC examination required.

- iii. Lacy Jarvis  
(Beauty Operator: Esthetician)

It was moved by Vice Chairperson Hall, seconded by Mr. Murata, and unanimously carried to approve Ms. Jarvis' beauty operator application, with NIC examination required.

- iv. Denise Jones  
(Beauty Operator: Cosmetologist)

It was moved by Vice Chairperson Hall, seconded by Mr. Murata, and unanimously carried to approve Ms. Jones' beauty operator application, with NIC examination required.

D. Ratification List (see attached list)

It was moved by Vice Chairperson Hall, seconded by Mr. Murata, and unanimously carried to ratify the list of issued licenses attached (see attached list).

Correspondence:

Chairperson Williams asked if any members of the public would like to provide oral testimony on this agenda item.

- A. E-mail inquiry: Is Honolulu Nail Academy, LLC, authorized to provide a completely online esthetician course that meets State licensing requirements?

Executive Officer Green stated that on December 22, 2020, the Board approved licensed schools and instruction provided via distance learning during the period of the COVID-19 pandemic, provided that schools comply with standards from the May 22, 2017, meeting. She further stated that at the October 25, 2022 meeting, the Board determined that effective January 1, 2023: (i) up to 25%, at most, of the theory curriculum may be taught via distance learning for students starting a program in a beauty school on or after January 1, 2023; and (ii) the practical

application theory portion of any such distance learning shall not be performed on live subjects and may only be performed on mannequins. This determination applies prospectively only and does not overturn or otherwise modify prior Board of Barbering and Cosmetology (“Board”) approvals.

***Yuko Ho was promoted to panelist.***

Yuko Ho introduced herself to the Board as the General Manager of the beauty school, Honolulu Nail Academy, LLC. She stated that they were previously approved for 100% theory at a 2010 meeting and approved to provide curriculum methodology through an online practical program at the May 22, 2017, meeting.

Executive Officer Green clarified that at the May 22, 2017, meeting, the Board approved an online practical program for Honolulu Nail Academy’s nail technician curriculum. She stated that at that time, Honolulu Nail Academy, LLC, was only licensed to offer the nail technician curriculum. She further clarified that Honolulu Nail Academy, LLC, was subsequently licensed in 2018 to offer the esthetician curriculum, after having received Board approval for their nail technician online practical program at the May 22, 2017, meeting.

Ms. Ho stated that she will send an email to the Board to discuss the matter further.

***Yuko Ho returned to an attendee.***

Old Business:

Chairperson Williams asked if any members of the public would like to provide oral testimony on this agenda item. There were none.

A. Licensed Schools and Instruction Provided via Distance Learning

Executive Officer Green stated that on December 14, 2022, the Board sent a notice to all licensed beauty schools regarding distance learning. The notice informed the beauty schools that effective January 1, 2023: (i) up to 25%, at most, of the theory curriculum may be taught via distance learning for students starting a program in a beauty school on or after January 1, 2023; and (ii) the practical application theory portion of any such distance learning shall not be performed on live subjects and may only be performed on mannequins. This determination applies prospectively only and does not overturn or otherwise modify prior Board of Barbering and Cosmetology (“Board”) approvals.

Executive Officer Green stated that at the February 28, 2023 meeting, the Board approved Paul Mitchell the School Honolulu, LLC to teach 100% of the theory curriculum, excluding theory practical or practical application,

via distance learning, provided that it is not more than 25% of the total curriculum.

Lieren Pearson attended the meeting in-person and requested to testify on this agenda item. She introduced herself to the Board as the Owner/Founder of a licensed beauty school, The Skin Institute Internationalé. Ms. Pearson stated that their school is accredited by COMTA, which allows 49% of the esthetics program to be taught virtually nationwide. She stated that there are many platforms that make this doable, interactive, and effective. She further stated that they would love the opportunity to be able to offer this option to their students and be able to offer more than 25% online specifically for theory curriculum and interaction. She asked if the Board would consider allowing more than 25% of the entire curriculum be taught via distance learning.

Vice Chairperson Hall asked Ms. Pearson if they are currently using these platforms.

Ms. Pearson replied that they are currently teaching 100% of the curriculum in-person, but have the capabilities, the capacity, and the knowhow to implement virtual learning programs such as SIMA. She stated that the SIMA program tracks students' hours, IP address, and devices for effective and controlled distance learning. She opined that it is feasible to offer 100% theory online.

Vice Chairperson Hall asked Ms. Pearson if theory is more than 25% of their curriculum.

Ms. Pearson answered in the affirmative.

Vice Chairperson Hall asked Ms. Pearson what the percentage was.

Ms. Pearson replied that she would double check and get back to the Board.

Discussion ensued regarding theory curriculum and theory practical.

Ms. Pearson requested that the Board wait to make a decision on this agenda item until after she's provided her presentation.

***Carly Sai was promoted to panelist.***

Ms. Sai introduced herself to the Board as the Director of Paul Mitchell the School Honolulu. She suggested that the Board update Hawaii Administrative Rules Chapter 78, "Exhibit C" of the Beauty School Curriculum and provide a specific breakdown of hours between theory curriculum and theory practical. She stated that she will provide an

example of this breakdown of hours to the Board's email.

Executive Officer Green stated that the Board will be working on updating their Hawaii Administrative Rules at a future meeting.

***Carly Sai returned to an attendee.***

***It was the Board's consensus to take the below agenda item out of order.***

New Business:

A. Request For Approval of Online Esthetician Program (The Skin Institute Internationalé, Mary Ronnow and Lieren Pearson)

Ms. Pearson attended the meeting in-person and made a presentation to the Board of a proposed online esthetician program at The Skin Institute Internationalé.

Vice Chairperson Hall expressed concern regarding a 100% online esthetician training program. including a lack of customer service interaction and time management skills. She asked how they would overcome language barriers with a 100% online training program.

Ms. Pearson responded that skills are taught but passion cannot be taught. She stated that if an individual is passionate, they would take responsibility upon themselves to be on time and interact with the customers. She further stated that they have access to students, graduate, students, and instructors that speak different languages. She said they are open to adding subtitles and making accommodations for each student to be successful and to complete the program.

Discussion ensued regarding practical theory training and how that is monitored. Ms. Pearson stated that there are different protocols to be assessed via live video proctoring.

Chairperson Williams asked if they are asking for a 49% online or 100% online esthetician program.

Ms. Pearson responded that they are asking for 100% online esthetician program.

Mr. Basta expressed concern regarding students practicing on live subjects without a controlled sanitary environment.

Ms. Pearson responded that the Department of Health used to oversee beauty shop regarding public health and safety



requirements but does not anymore. She stated that sanitation and disinfection is taught in the program. She stated that it could be specified in the program that all assessments and/or live practical application would be performed on an individual living within the same household. She further stated that they could do a virtual station sanitation check before each live video assessment.

Vice Chairperson Hall stated that this sounds like a great idea and sees the potential of this online esthetician program but opined that the concept still needs a lot of work to address all the different variables that may arise.

Ms. Pearson stated that she is willing to develop relationships with licensed neighbor island beauty shops so the students registered for this online esthetician program may possibly incorporate an internship, interactive labs, or customer service relations.

Chairperson Williams advised Ms. Pearson to check with COMTA if they require a licensed beauty instructor to be at the beauty shop where the internship will take place.

The Board expressed the following concerns with the proposed 100% online esthetician program: (i) practicing on live subjects/individuals without a controlled sanitary environment that a licensed beauty school provides; and (ii) the performance of practical application on live subjects/individuals without the oversight of an in-person instructor.

Ms. Pearson stated that her initial presentation asked for a 100% online esthetician program but is now asking the Board to consider a 49% online esthetician program should COMTA allow their esthetician program to be online, including all theory curriculum and theory practical training performed only on mannequins.

It was moved by Vice Chairperson Hall, seconded by Chairperson Williams, and unanimously carried to deny the request of the 600 hours online esthetician program for The Skin Institute Internationalé.

***The Board recessed the meeting at 3:36 p.m. and returned at 3:41 p.m.***

***It was the Board's consensus to return to the below agenda item.***

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Old Business:           A.     Licensed Schools and Instruction Provided via Distance Learning

It was moved by Mr. Murata, seconded by Chairperson Williams, and unanimously carried that effective June 1, 2023: (i) 100% of theory curriculum may be taught via distance learning for students starting a program in a beauty school on or after June 1, 2023; and (ii) the practical application theory portion of any such distance learning shall not be performed on live subjects and may only be performed on mannequins. This determination applies prospectively and does not overturn prior Board of Barbering and Cosmetology (“Board”) approvals of individual schools’ curriculum.

B.     Barbering and Cosmetology Examinations

A.     Request to Allow Students to Receive More Than 8 Hours Instruction Per Day/More Than 40 Hours Per Week

It was moved by Chairperson Williams, seconded by Mr. Murata, and unanimously carried to deny the request to allow students to receive more than 8 hours of instruction per day/more than 40 hours per week, pursuant to Hawaii Administrative Rules section 16-78-60, which states “The program of instruction for any instructor or student shall not exceed forty hours per week nor more than eight hours in one day”.
